
I raise questions we might ask ourselves:

**Share the ride** (comment: make artistic friends - come to RFAA meetings)

From Lucy Pittman: One of my favorite paintings that I have finished is actually a rather large one for me. It hangs in our dining room over the sideboard. My mother was an excellent seamstress as well as an avid gardener. She made all my clothes when I was a child. When my daughter was born, mother's interest in French hand sewing took off! Every Easter and Christmas her only granddaughter wore a new beautiful creation. My painting is from a "modeling" session with my granddaughters wearing two of the Easter dresses, vintage hats, and bare feet, posing in my mom's garden. Lots of fun and wonderful memories.



From **Judy Carr**: "Wyatt at the Beach" is my favorite piece of artwork. I did it in pastel from a photograph my son took of my grandson. I loved creating the texture in the sand and the curl in his hair. I will say, the squatted pose was quite a challenge. This piece was honored with several awards.



From **Pat Hahn**: My Mum was a very sweet lady. In this painting titled "Mum in the Purple Hat ... Finally," there is a story behind it. Every time I look at it, it brings back memories of my niece's wedding. We were in England for the big event and I had purchased a hat for Mum to wear with her outfit. She spotted the purple hat I was going to wear, thought it was hers and seemed disappointed when I told her that hers was the other one. So when I did this painting of Mum, I felt compelled to put her in the purple hat and it's a very special painting to me.



From **Ana LLaurado**: This is my favorite painting to date, not only because it has so much color and movement, but because I was able to combine it with my computer skills. I used Photoshop to figure where the colors would go. I then painted in a complementary color for a base. I finished by adding the wonderful bright colors in such a calming scene and made the values work. I love acrylics and the way they cover paint already applied, but then are able to do a bit of glazing to give more life to colors or dull them down if needed. On a side note; kayaking is something I did while I lived in Florida. I have not gotten around to experiencing this in Georgia. This a canoe in

the painting, but is the same experience. I have two favorite things in one painting.

### Macular Degeneration Gave Mary Wyman a Different View

Mary was diagnosed with macular degeneration about 10 years ago, when she was painting in acrylics on small canvases. The diagnosis caused her to change the way she painted. She first knew she could no longer see small things like features, so she would have to change her painting style. She switched to large canvases, large brushes, and oils.

She still maps her way using acrylics as a guide underneath her oils, but sticks to a limited palette since she has trouble reading the names of the paints. She limits her palette to two blues, ultramarine and cerulean; two reds, magenta and cadmium red; two yellows, ochre and Naples, and white. Mary now paints in a loose style somewhat abstract and expressionistic.

Her paintings since the onset of the macular degeneration are inspiration to others who may have physical challenges that interfere with creating art. She now does not paint every detail, but leaves more to the viewer's imagination. She is selling more art now than she ever did before. Check out her Facebook page at Fine Art by Mary Wyman.






